NETFISH Kolkata had organized an awareness programme on Sea Safety & Navigation at Jettyghat, Freserganj, South 24 Parganas on 25th February 2019, which was attended by 30 participants including Coast Guard Officials, Skippers and Boat owners. Shri P. K. Mitra, Pradhan Adhikari, Coast Guard, Freserganj inaugurated the programme and briefed about their organization setup and activities. He also emphasized on safety and security at sea, importance of registration & licensing of fishing vessels, use of different life saving equipment such as life jacket, life buoy, life raft, Distress Alert Transmitter (DAT) machine, AIS etc., VHF, HF & MF transmission system, different communication measures during distress etc. He also urged the trainees to carry a biometric identity card during fishing and do not cross 88°30'E as beyond this point the area falls under Bangladesh. Shri T. K Giri explained about the day time signals and night signals for safe navigation at sea, different rescue signals such as MAY DAY, PAN-PAN, and SECURITE etc. and never use Channel 16 without any emergency. Shri. Sengupta, NGO requested the boat owners to keep necessary life saving equipments as suggested by the Coast Guard officials and also explained about the use of Satellite based vessel monitoring system in the fishing boat as per IUU fishing.





Sea Safety training

To develop capacity building and strengthen the fisher women Self Help Groups to support the livelihood diversification of the fishermen community NETFISH-MPEDA, Kolkata had organized hands on training programmes on 'Value Added Fishery Products' on 8th February 2019 at Junput, Contai, Purba Medinipur. About 30 participants from SEBIKA Women Self Help Group attended the training. Shri. Atanu Ray, SCO, NETFISH welcomed all the trainees, delegates and dignitaries in the programme and briefly described the activities of NETFISH and the aim of the programme. He also said that hygienic value added fish products can be prepared using low value fishes and can fetch better price, thereby improving the livelihood of fishers. For the training NETFISH arranged all the ingredients, vegetables, fish, prawn, necessary utensils and accessories and the SCO demonstrated preparation of various products such as fish ball, fish pickle, prawn pickle, Fish cutlet, coated prawn products such as breaded butterfly, breaded stretched shrimp, fish pakora etc. to the trainees and they too were engaged in the process. Recipes of the above said products printed in Bengali language were given to the participants. The trainees were convinced by the taste and quality of the products prepared and they gained confidence to prepare these fish items on commercial scale. The programme ended with vote of thanks by Shri. Ujjwal Kr. Sar.





Value addition training programme

MPEDA and NETFISH had conducted 3 MPEDA RPL training programme under PMKVY during 11- 13 February at Nezami Rekha Sea Food Pvt. Ltd Kolkata, 18-20 at M/S. S. S. Sea Food Pvt. Ltd, North 24 Parganas, and 21-23 at M/s. Sea Foods Pvt. Ltd, Sankarpur. DD, MPEDA inaugurated the programme and distributed the PMKVY training kit consisted of apron, cap,

writing pad, pen, leaflet, writing board, etc. to all the participants. SCO described about the various aspects such as hygiene & sanitation practices in fish & seafood sector, chlorination level, cleaning & sanitation process, cleaning schedule, HACCP system, GMP, SSOP & SOP, spoilage of fish, freezing, fish preservation techniques, traceability of product etc. A demonstration on use of change room, hand washing & sanitation, cleaning of table & utensils, raw material inspection, grading and packing etc were also shown to the participants.

NETFISH Odisha had conducted 4 numbers of NFDB sponsored square mesh cod end fabrication

training programmes at Paradeep, Balaramgadi, Bahabalapur and Dhamara on 9th, 12th, 14th, and 16th of the month respectively. In each programme, 50 numbers of net makers were given the training on conversion of diamond mesh to square mesh cod end. In all the training programmes, SCO gave detailed class on benefits of square mesh cod end and objectives of the training programme. After the theory section, the master trainer from the fishermen group showed the technique of conversion of





diamond mesh to square mesh cod end. Later on each trainee was given a piece of diamond shaped net material and they converted it into square mesh individually. Evaluation of the converted net was done and corrections were given wherever necessary. The trainees were satisfied with the hands on training and suggested to conduct more such training programmes for leftover net menders. Mr.Gayadhar Jena, NGO, SRMSS took active participation in all the training programmes.

NETFISH Odisha had organized a harbour clean-up programme at Balaramgadi fishing harbour on 11th February 2019. During the programme SCO NETFISH explained the importance to conduct harbor cleanup programme. Around 30 participants including members of Balaramgadi

trawler association, SCO, NETFISH, Mr. Gayadhar Jena, NGO, SRMSS, Shri. Pramod kumar Sahoo, HDC, Harbour cleaning staffs, fishermen, net menders, and crew members had actively participated in the cleanup programme. NETFISH provided T-Shirt, caps and waste collection bags for the event.

NETFISH in association with NGO DFYWA had organized 4 training programmes on 'Onboard handling of Tuna fish' at Kakinada fishing harbour on 22nd, 23rd, 27th and 28th of the month respectively. During the training, 60 active fishermen were explained on production of sashimi grade tuna. A hands on training on killing, spiking, bleeding, degilling, gutting, chilling in slurry ice, preservation and storage was also conducted during the programme. The trainees were taught the systematic procedure for handling tunas on-board to supply sashimi grade tuna. The manual of handling tuna onboard in Telugu was distributed to the participants.

On 12th of the month, a Sea Safety programme was conducted at Visakhapattinam with the Coordination of NETFISH, DFYWA & Fisher Folk Foundation (FFF)Visakhapattinam. About 50 stakeholders including officials from Coast guard, Department of coastal security, Department of Fisheries, Marine Police and members from fishermen society had attended the training. During the programme SCO, NETFISH gave a talk on sea safety and navigation. He also explained and distributed the pamphlet in Telugu language on the latest subsidy schemes introduced by MPEDA. Fisheries Development Officer from Dept. of Fisheries also explained the schemes available for sea safety equipments. Shri. B. Arjili Dasu, DFYWA explained about the need & use of Safety equipments in fishing vessels. The officials from the Coast Guard made the demonstration of Sea safety equipments and explained its need in emergency. The different kind of equipments available in the market like Life buoy, life jacket, water proof torch etc were shown and displayed during the training programme.

NETFISH and its member NGOs DFYWA & SEARCH had conducted 3 numbers of NFDB sponsored Square mesh fabrication training programme at Kakinada, Machilipattinam and Nizampattinam on 14th, 19th and 24th of the month respectively. A total of 150 participants including boat owners, boat drivers and net menders were benefitted the training programme. Shri. Hanumanta Rao, SCO, NETFISH with a power point presentation explained the objectives of the programme and advantages of using square mesh at trawl cod ends. Officials from SIFT Kakinada & CIFT Vizag were the master trainers of the programme. They took practical classes on how to convert diamond mesh webbing to square mesh cod ends. All the participants actively participated in demonstration programme and prepared the model square mesh cod ends. They expressed their whole hearted gratitude for conducting successful training programme. Hand book on Square mesh cod end in Telugu language were distributed during the training programme.





Square mesh fabrication training programme

On 21st of the month, NETFISH along with NGO SEARCH had arranged a school children awareness programme at Government MPP High School, Nizampatnam. Around 50 students and teachers of the school had attended the programme. SCO & HDC NETFISH conveyed messages on Hygiene & Sanitation and importance of sustainable fisheries. NETFISH distributed leaflets on conservation & fish quality among the students & teacher. Animation video on sustainable fisheries was also shown to the students. NETFISH had provided a set of Height & Weight check scale to monitor the health of the school students.

During the month, NETFISH had conducted 4 GPS training programmes- at Chennai on 7th, at Cuddalore on 11th, and 2 programmes at Pondicherry on 13th & 14th of the month respectively. Each programme was attended by 30 participants including drivers, boat owners and boat labours. The trainees were made aware on the functions of GPS, various GPS receivers, GPS accuracy, GPS signal reception, how to record a waypoint, how to navigate to the recorded waypoints, how to use GPS waypoints in rescue situations, function of proximity alarm, troubleshooting etc. Also the trainees were explained about latitude, longitude and how it relates to the degree, minutes and seconds of GPS coordinates.



On 8th & 15th of the month, 2 Sea Safety programmes were conducted at Chennai & Pondicherry with the coordination of NGO FPO & SOHES in which 60 fishers and fish workers attended. The trainees were made aware about the importance of personal safety and demonstrated the safety equipments and how to manage the emergency situation. The trainees gained the knowledge about the safety equipments and they requested NETFISH to give lifesaving apparatus in subsidized rate.





Sea Safety awareness programme

During the month, 3 numbers of NFDB sponsored Square mesh fabrication training programmes were conducted on 19th, 20th & 21st at Chennai, Cuddalore and Ponicherry by which a total 164 fishermen and net makers were attended. The trainees were given theory and practical class on conversion of Diamond mesh to square mesh cod end. NETFISH distributed Hand book on Square mesh cod end in Tamil language to all the participants.

NETFISH had conducted 3 numbers of NFDB sponsored Square mesh fabrication training programme at Chinnamuttom, Colachel, & Muttom on 8th, 25th and 26th of the month respectively. A total of 150 participants including fishermen and net menders were benefitted by the training programme. Mr.Sudhakaran, Rtd. staff, CIFT, Kochi was the resource person in first training programme & the trained trainer Mr.Anto Lenin, Fishermen & Netmender, Secretary, Meenavar Orunginappu Sangam, Kottilpadu was the resource person in the other two programmes. During the trainings NETFISH gave a detailed lecture on importance of the training programme and advantages of square mesh cod end. Later on the participants were given hands on training on conversion of diamond mesh to square mesh cod end. NETFISH in association with Fisheries College and Research Institute (FC & RI), Thoothukudi had conducted one day workshop on "Popularization of fitting square mesh Panel in the cod end of Trawl nets" on 21st February 2019. Dr. N. Neethiselvan, Professor and Head, Department of Fishing Technology and Fisheries Engineering, FC&RI welcomed the gathering. Dr. P. Velayutham, Dean i/c., Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi in his presidential address stressed on the importance of fitting square mesh panel in cod end of trawl net. Dr. I. Jagadis, Principal Scientist, CMFRI, Thoothukudi inaugurated the function and highlighted the importance of By-catch Reduction Devices for solving economic loss in trawling. Dr. S. David Kingston, Professor & Head, Department of Fisheries Biology and Resource Management of FC&RI, Thoothukudi explained the need for avoiding juvenile fishing during trawling. Dr. Vinoth S Ravindran, SCO, NETFISH, highlighted the growing awareness among the fishermen on responsible fishing techniques in the recent years. He also stated that similar workshops will be conducted in collaboration with FC&RI, Thoothukudi in future. Mrs. N. Chandra, Joint Director of Fisheries, Thoothukudi (Regional) also welcomed the effort jointly taken by FC&RI,

Thoothukudi & NETFISH- MPEDA. Er. M. Sivasudalai Mani, Assistant Engineer, Department of Fishing Technology and Fisheries Engineering, FC&RI delivered vote of thanks. Designing of square mesh panel and fitting the same in the cod end of the trawl nets was also demonstrated during the programme. Mr. A. Karthy, Senior Research Fellow, Centre for incubation and Vocational Training in Fisheries, FC&RI coordinated the entire programme. At the end of the programme, the Dean distributed certificates to the participants.

Another Sea Club awareness programme on "Hygienic Production of Dry fish" was conducted at Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi on 28th February 2019. Two NFDB sponsored hands on training programmes on "Conversion of Diamond mesh to Square mesh cod end" were organized at Mangrol and Porbandar on 5th and 18th of the month respectively, with coordination of officials from CIFT Veraval. A total of 100 fishers including boat owners, skippers of vessels and net mending workers were trained by these programmes. Dr. Prajith K. K, Scientist CIFT, Veraval, Shri. H. V. Pungera, Senior Technical officer, CIFT and Shri.Jitendra Malamdi, Technician, CIFT through presentations, explained the trainees about the various types & patterns of nets used in fishing and the merits of square mesh cod end in the escapement of juvenile fishes. Shri. Jignesh Visavadia, State Coordinator, NETFISH also insisted the fishers that it is highly essential to use square mesh cod end in trawl nets to conserve the marine resources. After the theory sessions, the technology to convert diamond mesh nets to square mesh cod ends was demonstrated to all participants. Thereafter the trainees were given with piece of net material and asked to prepare square mesh cod end themselves. At the end of the programme feedback was collected and certificates were distributed to the participants. The President B.A.Y.E.R.D.F.T, member NGO of NETFISH, had taken enormous effort in successful accomplishment of the programmes.
