On 6th January'19 NETFISH in association with MPEDA Regional Division, Kolkata had convened an awareness programme on "Subsidy schemes by MPEDA for capture fisheries sector" at Kakdwip, South 24 Parganas. Around 45 participants including Dy. Director, MPEDA, State Coordinator, NGO members, representative of State fisheries department, stakeholders and boat owners had attended the programme. Assistance for installation of Satellite based Vessel Monitoring System and its utilities in connection with IUU fishing and for compliance with catch certificate regulation was narrated. The importance of MPEDA assistance for fishing nets incorporated with environment friendly and selective fishing methods like by-catch reduction devices (BRDs) i.e. Square mesh cod ends in the trawl net marine resources was also explained. All the participants appreciated the schemes and expressed willingness to install the SBVMS in their boats. On the same day NETFISH distributed 9 nos. of Life buoy to 9 boat owners through DD, MPEDA and Secretary of fishermen Association, under the Fishermen Aid Programme.

MPEDA and NETFISH had conducted 2 MPEDA RPL training programme under PMKVY during 17th to 19th January at M/s.Essex Marine and 23rd to 25th at M/s.KNC Agro Pvt. Ltd., Purba Medinipur. DD, MPEDA inaugurated the programme and distributed the PMKVY training kit consisted of apron, cap, writing pad, pen, leaflet, writing board, etc. to all the participants. SCO described about the various aspects such as hygiene & sanitation practices in fish & Seafood Sector, chlorination level, cleaning & sanitation process, cleaning schedule, HACCP system, GMP, SSOP & SOP, spoilage of fish, freezing, fish preservation techniques, traceability of product etc. A demonstration on use of change room, hand washing & sanitation, cleaning of table & utensils, raw material inspection, grading and packing etc were also shown to the participants.

Sea Safety trainings

NETFISH in association with NGO SRMSS had conducted a training programme on Sea Safety and Navigation at Paradeep fishing harbor on 10th January 2019 which was attended by 30 beneficiaries including driver, skipper and crew members. The trainees were made aware about the safety and security at sea, life saving & fire fighting equipments, safety measures at boat, protected areas for fishing, importance of registration & license of fishing boat, safety measures at boat, use of different life saving equipment such as life jacket, life buoy, life raft, distress alert transmitter machine and different communication measures during distress.

On 16th of the month, NETFISH Odisha conducted a special programme for Vocational school children at Dr.Jadunath Junior College, Balasore. Around 30 students attended the programme in which Mr. Gayadhar Jena of SRMSS took classes about fish quality & hygiene related topics. SCO also handled the session by covering the topics from fishing to export. After the theory session, fishery related videos were shown to the students and feedback was also collected.

On 29th, 30th, and 31st of the month, NETFISH in association with NGO SEARCH had conducted 3 Value added fishery product training programme at Gilakaladindi and Manginapudi of Machilipatnam. About 90 participants from 3 self help groups including fisherwomen, fish traders and wet fish vendors had actively participated in the training programme. Shri Arjillidasu, Executive Secretary of DFYWA and SCO described about the importance of the training programme and also explained about the importance of hygiene and sanitation of the processing areas. The trainer Mr. Krishna Bhagavan explained the procedure of making of fish cutlets, fish finger and fish balls, its ingredients and correct proportions and also cleared the doubts of trainees. All the members were engaged in preparation of various products such as fish fry and prawn 65. The prepared products were tasted by all the trainees.

NETFISH along with SEARCH NGO had organized a training programme on GPS at Manginapudi fish landing center of Machilipatnam on 26th January 2019. Around 30 numbers of active fishermen and boat owners who are going for hook and line fishing were attended the training programme. SCO explained about the function of GPS, different kind of available communication equipments, need of satellite GPS and its importance in traceability system, etc. Demonstration of the equipment was also done in the programme

NETFISH in association with NGO DFYWA had organized 3 training programmes on *On board handling of Tuna fish* at Kakinada fishing harbour on 29th, 30th, and 31st of the month respectively. During the training, 45 active fishermen were explained on production of sashimi grade tuna. A hands on training on killing, spiking, bleeding, degilling, degutting, chilling in slurry ice, preservation and storage was also conducted during the programme. The trainees were taught the systematic procedure for handling tunas on-board to supply sashimi grade tuna. The manual of handling tuna onboard in Telugu was distributed to the participants. During the month, NETFISH had conducted 2 GPS training programmesone at Nagapattinam on 7th and the other at Pondicherry on 28th, each programme attended by 30 participants including drivers, boat owners and boat labours. The trainees were made aware on the functions of GPS, various GPS receivers, GPS accuracy, GPS signal reception, how to record a waypoint, how to navigate to the recorded waypoints, how to use GPS

waypoints in rescue situations, function of proximity alarm, troubleshooting etc. Also the trainees were explained about latitude, longitude and how it relates to the degree, minutes and seconds of GPS coordinates.

On 29th of the month, a Sea Safety programme was conducted at Kasimedu with the coordination of NGO FPO in which 28 fishers and fish workers attended. The trainees were made aware about the importance of personal safety and demonstrated the safety equipments

and how to manage the emergency situation. The trainees gained the knowledge about the safety equipments and they requested NETFISH to give lifesaving apparatus in subsidized rate.

To initiate awareness among fishing village students on the issues of sustainable use of living and non-living resources of the seas around Tuticorin region, NETFISH had conducted 2 school children awareness programme at Tharuvaikulam Government Higher Secondary school, Tharuvaikulam on 18th January and at T. Saveriyarpuram R.C Govt High school, Tuticorin on 19th January 2019 respectively. In the awareness programme, Dr. Vinoth Ravindran, SCO, NETFISH explained the importance of protection of coastal and marine ecosystems and ill effects of illegal fishing and the depletion of fishing resources to the school children. During the programme, Recitation competitions on "Harmful effects and eradication of plastic wastes in the coasts", Drawing competition on the topic "Conservation of coastal and marine ecosystems", and Essay writing competition on "Conservation of fish and fishery resources" were also conducted. Around 350 students including Principal and staffs, Ex. Panchayath Leader, members from

social workers forum, and NGO were took part in the events. NETFISH distributed mementos and certificates to the winners of the competitions.



School Children Awareness programme

A Sea club awareness programme on "Conservation of Critical habitats" was conducted at Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi on 30th January 2019. Dr.S.David Kingston, Professor and Head, Department of Fisheries Biology and Resource Management welcomed the gathering. A total of 40 participants including college students and fishermen attended the awareness programme. The Dean, Fisheries College and Research Institute in his presidential address talked about the importance of critical habitats and its need to be conserved. Dr.Vinoth Ravindran, SCO NETFISH spoke about the involvement of fishermen on the conservation of critical habitats and urged the fishermen to avoid illegal practices of fish capture. A book on "Conservation of critical habitats" (in Tamil) was released and the first copy was received by the State Co-ordinator, NETFISH. Miss. V.Vidhya, teaching assistant proposed vote of thanks. After the inaugural function, special lectures were delivered on conservation of coral reefs, conservation of mangroves and conservation of sea grass ecosystems. A panel discussion was also arranged and the fishermen raised questions about the field level problems involved in conservation. Finally NETFISH distributed certificates to the participants



SeaClub Programmes

Another Sea Club awareness programme on "Tamilnadu marine fishing regulation act 1983" was conducted at Fisheries College and Research Institute, Thoothukudi on 31st January 2019. A total of 40 participants including College students and fishermen attended the programme. The Dean, Fisheries College and Research Institute, Dr. N.Neethiselvan, Professor, Dr.S.Davidkingston, Professor, Miss. V.Vidhya, Teaching Assistant and Dr.Vinoth Ravindran, SCO,

NETFISH were given detailed lectures on the topics contents of Tamilnadu marine fishing regulation Act, 1983, Best fishing practices to be followed in the open sea, implementation of the act and the methods to be followed for making it a reality, rules regarding the registration of fishing vessels and licensing of boats, rules regarding the movements of vessels in the sea, reporting authority, licensing authority, ownership values, validity of registration, cancellation of license, expiry of registration, refusal of registration, appeals, seizing of vessels, penalties, cancellation and revision of registration, protection of fishermen and need to translate the act . A panel discussion was also arranged to get the feedback from the fishermen on the implementation of Tamilnadu Marine fishing regulation act, 1983. The points raised by the fishermen were taken into consideration. At the end of the programme, the Dean distributed certificates to the participants.

School children awareness programme

During the month, NETFISH conducted 3 School children awareness programme at St.Mary's High School, Pallippuram on 7^{th} January and at Govt. High School, Kadappuram on 15^{th} & 18^{th} January 2019. A total of 230 students were attended the awareness programme in which SCO given lectures on topic related to capture and culture fisheries.



VHSE programmes

Two numbers of VHSE programmes were conducted at VHSS, Kaipamangalam on 11th January and Govt. VHSS, Kadappuram on 15th January 2019. During the training programme, the students were described on capture fisheries, culture fisheries, hygienic handling of fishes, conservation, sustainable fishing, etc. NETFISH distributed leaflets on conservation & fish quality among the students & teachers. NETFISH documentary films were also shown to the students. Around 160 students attended the training programme.

NETFISH conducted 3 numbers of NFDB sponsored square mesh cod end fabrication training programmes at Puthiyappa, Beypore and Vypeen on 24th, 25th and 28th of the month

respectively. In each programme, 50 numbers of net makers were given the training on conversion of diamond mesh to square mesh cod end. The programme at Puthiyappa was inaugurated by Shri. K.K.Sathish Kumar, Joint director North Zone, Fisheries Department in a function presided over by Sri. Sukumaran, President of Arayasamajam. The programme at Beypore was inaugurated by Smt. Renjini P.K, Assistant Director, Fisheries in a function presided over by Shri. Santhosh N.K, SCO NETFISH. The programme at Vypeen was inaugurated by Shri. M.S.Saju, Joint Director Central Zone, Department of Fisheries in a function presided over by Dr. Joice V. Thomas, CE, NETFISH. In all the training programmes, SCO gave detailed class on benefits of square mesh cod end and objectives of the training programme. Shri.Unnikrishnan A.V, trained trainer provided hands on training to the trainees on conversion of diamond mesh to square mesh cod end.



Square mesh cod end fabrication training

In addition to the above, NETFISH conducted a square mesh fabrication training programme at Munakkakadavu fish landing centre on 17th January 2019. The net makers were explained about the advantages of square mesh cod ends over the conventional diamond mesh cod end. They were given hands on training on conversion of diamond mesh to square mesh cod end. About 16 net makers attended the training programme.

A door to door programme was conducted in Pallippuram fishing village and Cherai fishing village on 8th and 9th January respectively and sensitized the Fishers on sustainable fishing methods through direct interaction with them and distributing leaflets.

An onboard training programmes was conducted during the month at Munambam and the fishers were given awareness and training on hygienic fish handling methods onboard and the need of life saving equipments in fishing vessels. Also life jackets were provided to the crew.
