Summary

Extension activities by NETFISH along the maritime states of India during December 2016 consisted of 182 awareness programmes, which were comprised of 162 regular awareness classes (see Table 1), and 20 special programmes such as street play (16 nos.), medical camp (1 no), clean-up programme (1 no.), school programme (1 no.), and 1 other special programme (see Table 2). The regular awareness classes were attended by a total of 4227 beneficiaries whereas the special programmes were estimated to be beneficial for around 1725 stakeholders. Other activities during the month included a few meetings and discussions with Fisheries officials and stakeholders to resolve issues related to fish quality management and conservation of marine resources.

In Andhra Pradesh, 12 awareness programmes were conducted in December 2016. During fish quality management training programmes, plastic baskets and sheets were distributed to the beneficiaries instead of stipend. On 2nd of the month, SCO coordinated the visit of DD MPEDA and representative of Turn Point Technologies for replacing CFL with LED lights in fishing vessels to avoid glass contamination at Visakhapatnam FH. On 6th December, SCO had attended the visit of local MLA along with DD, MPEDA and JD Fisheries to Visakhapatnam fishing harbour and explained him about the model dry fish unit and its need. On 15th of the month, SCO along with AD, MPEDA had attended the Kakinada fishing harbour management committee meeting and discussed the issues to form Harbour management society. DD fisheries asked the MoA of Munambam fishing harbour for reference. On 7th December, SCO coordinated with MPEDA for ornamental fish awareness programme for fisher women society with the support of DFYWA at Mangamaripeta. On 8th of the month, SCO met the Visakhapatnam port officials and discussed about the model dry fish unit and letter submitted for allotment of land.
