Summary

Extension activities by NETFISH along the maritime states of India during January 2017 consisted of 157 awareness programmes, which were comprised of 143 regular awareness classes (see Table 1), and 14 special programmes such as street play (10 nos.), medical camp (1 no), school programme (2 nos.), and 1 other special programme (see Table 2). The regular awareness classes were attended by a total of 4087 beneficiaries whereas the special programmes were estimated to be beneficial for around 946 stakeholders. Other activities during the month included a few meetings and discussions with Fisheries officials and stakeholders to resolve issues related to fish quality management and conservation of marine resources.

Director, MPEDA, RO, Kolkata had attended stall of MPEDA in the occasion of "Bengal Fish Fest 2017" at Salt Lake City, Kolkata. On 9th January 2017, SCO along with Dy. Director, MPEDA, RO, Kolkata had conducted site inspection for construction of new processing plant M/s. Sea Doris Pvt. Ltd. at Bhangour, North 24 Parganas. On 13th of the month, a school programme on fish guality management and conservation was conducted at Pichhabani Baniniketan High School, Purba medinipur. Around 106 students attended the programme. On 15th of the month, SCO had attended the Sea Food Festival and Ganga Utsav at Digha mohana, Purba Medinipur organized by Digha Fishermen & Fish Traders Association. Shri. Shuvendu Adhikari, Hon'ble Minister of Transport, Govt. of West Bengal, Shri. D. Das Matsya Karmadhakshya Zilla Parishad Purba Medinipur, Shri. Ramkrishna Sardaer, ADF (Marine), Shri. Ujjwal Kumar Sengupta, NGO, Chairman, Secretary & other member of DFFTA and about 1000 fishermen and boat owners attended the programme. SCO highlighted on fish quality and significances of using PVC baskets and PVC shovels in the fishing boats and fish markets to handle the fishes. During the programme, NETFISH distributed 100 nos. of plastic baskets and 80 nos. of PVC shovels to the boat owners.

Extension activities in Odisha during the month consisted of 8 awareness programmes. During the regular programmes leaflets containing information on fish

quality management and personal hygiene were distributed to the participants. Also LED Torch Light was given instead of stipend to them. On 24th of the month, a medical camp was conducted in Paradeep fishing harbour. In the camp 215 fishers have been thoroughly examined by the Doctors for general health including blood pressure, diabetic test etc. and free medicines were dispensed among them as per Doctor's prescription.

On 27th of the month, a Vocational School training programme was conducted at Dr. Jadunath Junior College, Rasalpur, Balasore. Around 30 students, School Principal and other faculties attended the programme. During the training programme, Mr. Gayadhar Jena, NGO, SRMSS took classes about fish quality and hygiene aspects. Then SCO handled the session on the topics general fishery, method of fish culture, type of aquaculture, conservation, crafts and gears, linkage of departments in Fisheries, inland, brackish water, and marine fisheries in Odisha, fishing harbours in Odisha, seafood processing, etc. NETFISH documentary videos were also shown to them. After the theory session a debate competition was conducted among the school students and the feedback was also collected. All the faculties praised NETFISH activities and the Principal urged NETFISH to conduct more number of training programmes including field trip to nearby fishing harbours\landing centres, seafood processing unit, etc.

In Andhra Pradesh, 14 awareness programmes were conducted in January 2017. During fish quality management training programmes, plastic baskets and sheets were distributed to the beneficiaries instead of stipend. On 4th of the month, SCO coordinated the meeting with boat owners and LED light suppliers to replace CFL with LED lights in fishing vessels. On 6th of the month, SCO met AD, Fisheries and handed over the MoA of Munambam Fishing Harbour Management Society for the formation of fishing harbour management society at Kakinada. On 13th, 14th, and 25th of the month, SCO along with NGO met Visakhapatnam port officials to allot the land for model dry fish unit. Port officials directed estate manager to give permission letter to NETFISH by demarking the required area. On 26th of the month, SCO had arranged a discussion with the fishermen and President, Vodarevu fishermen society for availing insulated fish box subsidy from MPEDA.

Along Northern coastal region of Tamil Nadu, 10 regular awareness programmes were conducted during the month. On 5th of the month, SCO along with DD, MPEDA attended 'Water Expo 2017' at Nandhambakkam Trade Centre, Chennai. On 6th January, SCO had attended the training programme organized by CIFNET Chennai, funded by NFDB and delivered a lecture on Tuna sashimi grade processing to the beneficiaries from various coastal districts of Tamil Nadu who get state government 100% subsidy for construction of tuna boat. On 11th of the month, SCO along with CE, NETFISH arranged a consultative meeting with Boat Owner's Association members and Harbour Management Committee members at Karaikkal and Nagapattinam. Around 110 fisher folk participated in both the meetings. During the programme, NETFISH distributed 30 numbers of plastic shovels to the fishing harbour management committee members at Nagapattinam. On 12th January 2017, SCO along with CE had arranged another consultative meeting with Dr. Velvizhi and dry fish women workers at Poombuhar. Around 30 fisher women members participated in the programme. Another discussion was also arranged with Deputy Director of fisheries, Karaikkal regarding the harbour development. During the month, several other meetings were also arranged with Boat Owner's Association members and Assistant Director of Fisheries at various regions of Tamil Nadu.
