Summary

Extension activities by NETFISH along the maritime states of India during March 2017 consisted of 171 awareness programmes, which were comprised of 136 regular awareness classes (see Table 1), and 35 special programmes such as street play (29 nos.), medical camp (1 no.), cleanup (1 no.), school programme (2 nos.), mass communication programme (1 no.) and 1 other special programme (see Table 2). The regular awareness classes were attended by a total of 3529 beneficiaries whereas the special programmes were estimated to be beneficial for around 2181 stakeholders. Other activities during the month included a few meetings and discussions with Fisheries officials and stakeholders to resolve issues related to fish quality management and conservation of marine resources.

- Participation in the advanced training programme on “Ideal ornamental fish culture” organized by MPEDA and Fisheries Research and Extension Centre, Madhavaram, Chennai
- Harbour cleanup programme at Tharuvaikulam fish landing centre

In West Bengal, 9 extension programmes were conducted during March 2017. On 1st and 15th of the month, SCO coordinated with the section officer and DD, RO, MPEDA, Kolkata for the final inspection of installation of fish hold at Raidighi, South 24 Parganas. On 27th and 28th March 2017, SCO had attended an expert group workshop on “Platform for consultation on Hilsa Conservation and Livelihoods” organized by International Water Association (IWA) at Kathmandu, Nepal. Different stakeholders including policymakers, research community, scientists, Govt. officials, NGOs and conservationists were participated in the workshop. During the programme, SCO had given a presentation on development of Hilsa fisheries in West Bengal and alternative livelihoods to the Hilsa dependent fishers and also discussed in open forum towards developing a platform on reconciling Hilsa conservation and livelihoods. On 30th March 2017, SCO had attended the training programme on “Marine Fisheries Training on Safety at Sea and Communication Development, Boat building, use of Fishing Gears etc” at Community Hall, Khejuri –II, Panchayet Samity, Purba Medinipur and delivered a talk on Conservation, Sustainable marine fish production, judicious exploitation, fishing ban and development of exports of marine products and ban on using formalin & other harmful chemicals in dry fish and other fishery products. During the month, SCO along with NGO visited Narayan Vidyamandir, Namkhana and Begunbari High School, Jhinukkhali, Purba Medinipur for discussing about the Vocational school children training programmes.
