Summary

Extension activities by NETFISH along the maritime states of India during May 2016 consisted of 81 regular awareness programmes, (*see Table 1*). The regular awareness classes were attended by a total of 2260 beneficiaries. Other activities during the month included a few meetings and discussions with Fisheries officials and stakeholders to resolve issues related to fish quality management, juvenile fishing and conservation of marine resources.

Major Highlights of the month

- A meeting with Commissioner of fisheries and Chief Secretary of Andhra Pradesh at CM camp office, Vijayawada to discuss about development of tuna fisheries in the state.
- Participation in NABARD sponsored program on "Ornamental Fish Culture" at CRS-DeRose Society, Tuticorin.
- Participation in FIMSUL program organized by the Fisheries College and Research Institute (FC&RI), Tuticorin at Kombuthurai.
- Distribution of two numbers of large size Stainless Steel trays to Karanja Machimar Society at Sassoon dock fishing harbour.

Extension activities in Odisha during the month consisted of 3 regular awareness programmes. During the programmes leaflets containing information on fish quality management and personal hygiene were distributed to the participants. Also T-shirts were given instead of stipend to them. SCO along with AD, MPEDA, SRO, BBSR visited Balaramagadi landing centre and Alasore marine sea food unit on 14th and 15th of the month respectively. On 20th of the month the SCO attended the EC meeting of Paradeep fishing harbour management committee held at Conference hall, Paradeep fishing harbour.

3. Andhra Pradesh

In Andhra Pradesh, no training programmes were conducted during the month. On 3rd May 2016, SCO had attended the meeting convened by the Commissioner of fisheries and Chief Secretary to the Government, Andhra Pradesh at CM camp office, Vijayawada. SCO NETFISH was selected as a member in technical expert committee in the development of tuna fisheries in the state. On 6th May 2016, SCO coordinated with DD, MPEDA for the inspection of fishing vessels with regard to new MPEDA registration and renewal. On 12th of the month, SCO had arranged a discussion with M/s Naga Surya Traders and coordinated with MPEDA and RGCA for the supply of seed to the new crab nursery initiated by NETFISH and RO MPEDA Vizag at Amalapuram, East Godavari District. On 19th of the month, SCO had arranged a discussion with boat owners regarding MPEDA subsidy schemes, online submission and the procedure of

registration in MPEDA website, at Dolphin Association, Fishing harbour, Visakhapatnam. On 20th of the month, SCO discussed with the boat owners about onboard ice making machine under MPEDA subsidy and informed the procedures to get advance approval. On 25th May 2016, another discussion was arranged with the boat owners and traders for the initiation of toll collection system at Visakhapatnam fishing harbour and to meet local leaders to convince them for the collection of toll.

In the month of May 2016, 6 regular training programmes were conducted in Kerala North region. On 20th May 2016, SCO attended the monthly meeting of Munambam fishing harbour management society. SCO also attended the general body meeting of the same at District Collectorate, Ernakulam on 24th May 2016.

8. Karnataka & Goa

During the month, no regular training programmes were conducted in Karnataka & Goa region. HDC's review meeting was conducted at SRO, MPEDA, Mangalore on 20th May 2016. SCO and NGO members visited University College, Mangalore, Govt College, Karwar and Vidyadayini College, Surathkal in connection with the formation of NETFISH Sea Club. On 24th of the month, SCO met DD, MPEDA and AD, EIA for discussing about the training programmes to be conducted in processing centres. On 25th May 2016, SCO contacted Dr. Rajesh, Senior Scientist, CMFRI, Mangalore for discussing about marine fish catch estimation in Karnataka and Goa region. SCO met JD and state fisheries officials for discussing about up-gradation of fishing harbour. Another two meetings were also arranged with stake holders in Honnawar and Bhatkal fishing harbour regarding slurry ice machine scheme implementation in fishing vessel. During the month, SCO visited Malpe and Mangalore fishing harbours several time for monitoring HDC's.

Extension programmes in Maharashtra, during May 2016 consisted of 14 regular programmes. Other activities during the month included a few meetings and discussions. HDC's review meeting was conducted at RO, MPEDA, Mumbai on 2nd May 2016. SCO along with Mr. Anil Gawade, Member NGO, NETFISH met Assistant commissioner of fisheries, Sindhudurg for discussing about department of fisheries schemes for fishers. Funds are allotted by District Planning Commission (DPC) for

Mangrove Crab Project for crab hatchery, crab culture, Vannamei hatchery, Ornamental fish culture, etc. NETFISH has provided two numbers of large size Stainless Steel trays to Karanja Machimar Society at Sassoon dock fishing harbour to promote hygienic handling of ice in the harbour.

During the month, 11 regular training programmes were conducted in Gujarat region. On 17th of the month, NETFISH organized a plastic dustbin distribution camp at Mangrol fishing harbour under fishermen aid programme. The programme was inaugurated by A Jeyabal, DD, RO, Veravel. Mr. Veljibhai Masani, Authority Member MPEDA, Mr.Ranchhodbhai Gosiya, President, Mahavir Fisheries Cooperative Society Ltd., Mangrol, and Mr. Kanjibhai B Jadav, President, B.A. Yadav Education & Rural Development Foundation Trust, Member NGO, NETFISH were present on the occasion. The intension of giving such kind of dustbin is to keep harbour clean and tidy and also to habituate fishermen to dump garbage in dustbin instead of harbour surroundings. 50 beneficiary/fishermen were selected for the programme. On 4th of the month, SCO met Vice president of the boat association, Veraval and discussed on 100% implementation of square mesh cod end in the next fishing session. On 10th of the month, SCO and DD, RO, Veraval conducted stake holders meeting along with officials of department of fisheries at RO, Veraval and made a presentation of MPEDA, new CIFH scheme. SCO and DD, RO, Veraval explained in detail about the scheme. On 13th May 2016, they visited Veraval fishing harbour and finalized the facilities required in Veraval fishing harbour under MPEDA CIFH scheme and submitted the proposal for development of fishing harbour. On 17th May 2016, SCO along with DD, RO, Veraval visited Mangrol fishing harbour for monitoring the HDC and DEO. On 20th of the month, SCO met leaders of Porbandar fishermen community and discussed with them to make arrangement for conducting training programmes on conversion of diamond mesh to square mesh cod end to enable 100% use of square mesh in coming season.
