(NETFISH)**

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Summary

Extension activities by NETFISH along the maritime states of India during October 2016 consisted of 198 awareness programmes, which were comprised of 194 regular awareness classes (see Table 1), and 4 special programmes such as clean-up programme (2 nos.), school children programme (1 no.) and 1 mass communication programme (see Table 2). The regular awareness classes were attended by a total of 5219 beneficiaries whereas the special programmes were estimated to be beneficial for around 121 stakeholders. Other activities during the month included a few meetings and discussions with Fisheries officials and stakeholders to resolve issues related to fish quality management and conservation of marine resources.

Major Highlights of the month

- Vocational school children awareness programme at Pratap Sasan Junior College, Balakati, Khurda.
- Participation in the workshop on “Scoping Tuna Fisheries Development” at Veraval jointly organized by BOBP and CMFRI.
- Mass boat cleanup programmes at Deshapran fishing harbour.
- Mass communication programme in Thoppumpady.
- Stakeholders meeting at MSSRF, Thangachimadam, Tamil Nadu South.

In West Bengal, 17 extension programmes were conducted during October 2016. On 6th and 21st of the month 2 mass boat cleanup programmes were conducted at Deshapran fishing harbour. On 19th of the month, a joint meeting was organized in the chamber of Deputy Director, RC (Aqua), Kolkata with Shri. S. X. Prince, Dy. Director RC (Aqua), Shri. S. K. Patra, Dy. Director R.O. Kolkata, Shri. Pradip Maity, Field Manager, NaCSA and State Coordinator, NETFISH regarding “Adulteration in Black Tiger Shrimp”. The discussion had been made to conduct awareness campaigns, trainings / meetings to create awareness among the stakeholders regarding the injecting the body of Black tiger shrimp with unwanted materials at the different fish auction markets located at North 24 Parganas and South 24 Parganas. State Coordinator had prepared syllabus of awareness programme on adulteration of shrimp and selected the targeted markets to conduct the awareness programmes. DD also discussed about budget and tentative schedule of the awareness programmes. On 20th October 2016, SCO had met Shri. Sovan Deb Sahoo, Nodal Officer, Dept. of Technical Education & Training at Contai Polytechnic, Contai, Purba Medinipur to discuss about the training programmes in Vocational schools where fisheries/aquaculture is taught as a subject at plus one & plus two level. SCO also collected the list of schools with contact details.

Extension activities in Odisha during the month consisted of 30 awareness programmes. During the regular programmes leaflets containing information on fish quality management and personal hygiene were distributed to the participants. Also LED Torch Light was given instead of stipend to them. On 26th of the month, NETFISH Odisha conducted a special programme for Vocational school children at Pratap Sasan Junior college, Balakati, Khurda. Around 30 students, School Principal-in-charge and faculties were attended the programme. During the programme Mr. U.C. Mohapatra,

Deputy Director (Aqua) took classes about aqua farming and related topics. SCO also handled the session by covering the topics from fishing to export. After the theory session, a debate competition was conducted among the school students and feedback was also collected. Prizes were also distributed to selected students. Fishery related videos were shown to the students during the programme.

In Andhra Pradesh, 17 awareness training programmes were conducted in October 2016.
